Phase One



Phase one is split into four stages

Stage One a) – comprises the new build of homes on the Fryerns School site. Start on site, subject to planning permission, should commence by Spring 2007. There will be approximately 00 new homes on this site with the first of them being available for residents towards the end of 2007. Some of these homes will be allocated to those residents wishing to stay on Craylands, both home owners and tenants.

Stage One b) c) and d) – comprises demolition of homes across the estate in sections from West to East (where the proposed new road will be), with new homes (flats and houses) being built each side of the new road. Some of these will be available for those residents affected in phase one who wish to stay on Craylands.

Phase One is due to be completed by January 2010

Phase Two - is due to start Autumn 2009 and be complete by Winter 2012. This will consist of the demolition of approximately 00 homes and building of 315 new homes at Fryerns and 144 new homes on Craylands.

Showing the plans

Following regular meetings with the Resident Design Steering Group, a Phase 1 Detailed Design Exhibition was held on 25th November 2006 at the Craylands Community Centre, giving you the opportunity to see the proposals before planning submission in mid December. We were pleased to see in excess of 80 residents at the exhibition, giving us the opportunity to answer residents' questions. The phase 1 development model is now in the Consultation Shop with scale house type mock-ups and all the display boards from the exhibition.

Keeping you updated

On 21 November 2006 Basildon District Council's Councillors resolved to grant planning consent for English Partnerships' plans for the regeneration of the Craylands Estate and former Fryerns School site. The formal consent is subject to referral to the Government Office for the East of England (which is normal due to the amount of development) and subject to a Section 106 Agreement (developer contributions). The planning application related to the principle of the regeneration proposals including building up to 750 new homes and rebuilding up to 700 homes. Swan Housing Group are now finalising the detailed application for Phase 1 of the project



Advice for residents

In order to reach as many residents as possible, Your Choice Housing Consultants, who were appointed as Independent Resident Advisors, are providing drop-in surgeries at the Exeter Close Elderly Persons Common Room (next to the Consultation Shop) every Monday 10am – 2pm and every Wednesday 3pm – 7pm. The Consultation Shop will be closed from 21st December and will re-open on 3rd January.

Will you be affected?

Works on the Phase 1 Craylands site will start from west to east. This is because Lovell have to change the electricity, gas and water connections to other locations. If you would like to find out how you might be affected, please pop into the Consultation Shop.

What do you think?

Basildon Council, in partnership with a number of local agencies, including the police and the Primary Care Trust, have been carrying out a survey on Craylands during December 2006. This survey focuses on the non-physical aspects of the re-development, to find out what residents think about issues such as crime, anti-social behaviour, activities for young people, the environment and education.

We will use the results of the survey to address the things that matter most to you, to improve now and in the future. We will be contacting a number of households across the estate, so please take the time to complete the questionnaire. Results from the survey will be made available to all residents in Spring 2007.

Hoarding at Exeter Close

Hoarding has been erected around the former AP Sheltered Housing Scheme at Exeter Close. The hoarding will protect the site during the demolition process. Demolition is expected to begin on 4th December.

Construction of new road

Work on building the new road through the estate will begin in December. The road will improve access to the estate during construction works and provide the route for improved public transport links.

Health Clinic

Discussions are ongoing between Swan, Basildon Council and the PCT regarding the health clinic's place in future developments. The plan to have a health clinic as part of the redeveloped Craylands estate is unchanged. Residents will be kept informed of any further developments.

Environmental Action Day

Residents welcomed teams from across the Council, Swan, St. George's and the police and fire services in focusing on clearing up refuse and graffiti on the estate on Saturday 3rd November. Over 15 tonnes of rubbish was collected, including 6 freezers, 11 fridges and 6 washing machines!

Exeter Close Demolitions

The former AP sheltered housing scheme at Exeter Close is currently being demolished. By the time this newsletter is distributed, the demolition should be completed, with some rubble and debris still being transported away to help tidy the site.

Swan has a policy of ensuring that residents living near developments are disrupted as little as possible. Swan's contractor Lovell makes every effort to ensure the impact of all construction works is minimised. For example, noise suppression, damping dust, specific routes to control traffic to and from the site and cleaning roads. Procedures are in place to ensure that inconvenience to residents is treated with utmost priority. Development Update

As you can see by the photograph below, works on site are progressing well. Since our last newsletter, our contractors have laid the surface for the base of the road; helping to reduce any potential dust and mud generated by their work.



In addition to these road works, the new construction access via Ely Way has been opened and this is now the main access for works

vehicles.

We've also continued to work on the houses and the foundations are underway; in advance of the timber frames being erected.

We're pleased to announce that the new car park for Adult Community Learning Basildon was available for

the beginning of the new college year. This new parking area can be accessed via Craylands. A new disabled drop off point has also been provided outside the front entrance and you can

access this via the original Ely Way entrance.

Masterplan Update

Urban Design Associates was invited to join Swan in preparing an implementation plan for the next phases of construction of the Craylands Regeneration Masterplan, which was adopted in November 2006. A team of designers held a series of meetings in September with residents, stakeholders and public officials to find ways of improving the plan and moving the process forward with agreement. The team held a four day design workshop and engagement process that welcomed the input of members of the community.

Participants were asked about the strengths and weaknesses of their existing environment and the proposed plan for Craylands. The answers to these simple questions



enabled the design team to identify major themes for improving the plan as development moves forward. The themes identified were: the need to build a more diverse range of building types and uses as found in the best neighbourhoods in the region, to provide an interconnected framework



of streets and open spaces that have a “normal” relationship to the front doors of houses, and to develop appropriate and safe access at each phase of construction.

As part of the workshop, initial ideas were presented and the community was asked to give their feedback. These responses are currently being considered and the

team will return on Wednesday 11th November 2009 to present the revised Masterplan recommendations at two community presentations. The design team will be hosting a daytime and an evening consultation session to make sure they hear from as many of you as possible. Residents and

stakeholders will be invited to give additional feedback and comments on the plan. Further details will be sent out soon.

Development update...


The work on the new homes is developing really well, with all the frames for the houses in place now. On some of the new blocks we have been able to remove the scaffold, which will allow us to complete the works to the outside of the houses.

Swan's contractors have the water and gas ready to be connected to completed properties, and will

also connect to the electric substation, when required.

To enable us to market the private for sale properties, we are just finishing work on the show homes, which will be completed for an official launch in June.

We would like to thank you for your co-operation and patience whilst these works are progressing.



Important information for the secure Tenants of Basildon District Council

Basildon District Council have now started to contact tenants living on Phase one, with secure tenancies, who are due to move under the Craylands Regeneration Project.

In most cases, tenants will be invited to attend an interview with an Allocation Officer from Basildon Council where an application form will be completed and the 'decant' process explained. You will have an opportunity during the interview to raise any questions/concerns you may have regarding this.

The application form will be used to determine your housing need, type of property you will be entitled to and your preferred choice of areas within the Basildon District. You may be

asked to supply documentation to support some of the information you provide, it is important that this is submitted to the Council as soon as possible as no offers of accommodation can be made until the application form has been fully processed and documentation required has been provided.

Under the decant programme, secure BDC tenants will be eligible for properties on a 'like for like' basis, however, it is important that you are aware, if you currently under-occupy family accommodation where there are two bedrooms or above in excess of your needs, you will only be offered a property with one bedroom in excess of your assessed needs.

Ground floor type accommodation will only be allocated to tenants who have a proven medical need. A medical form will need to be completed and this will be assessed by an independent medical advisor who is appointed by Basildon Council.

Tenants who are already occupying upper accommodation with children over the age of 13 years will not qualify for ground floor accommodation unless there is a proven medical need to do so.

Secure tenants living on Phases 2, 3 & 4 who are due to be moved under the regeneration project, will be contacted nearer the time when the decant process is due to start for these phases.

Property Buy Outs explained

If you're a homeowner in Phase 1 of the Craylands Regeneration and your property is scheduled for demolition, Swan would like to hear from you. We are currently buying out all the homeowners in this phase and will be contacting all affected homeowners to explain the options available. Please contact us on 0800 019 6766 or visit the Consultation Shop to speak to us.

As the regeneration develops, Swan will be buying properties from future phases. We expect to begin to purchase properties in Phase 2 during 2012.

If your property has been your main home for at least 12 months; you will be entitled to the value of your property, reasonable costs of moving and a 10% home loss payment (up to a maximum of £38,000). There will also be 2 options available:

Option 1 - Moving Elsewhere:

- If you wish to sell your property and move off the estate, Swan will purchase your house at full open market value.
- Swan is currently only buying properties within Phase 1; with later phases following on as the regeneration progresses

Option 2 - Remaining on the estate:

The facts:

- If you want to remain on the estate, you will have the option of becoming the shared equity owner of a new property
- You'll be eligible for a new property with the same number of bedrooms as your current home. If you'd like to buy a bigger or smaller home, please let us know and we can discuss this will you individually



- You must use the entire value of your current home to purchase a share of your new home.
- You'll need to purchase a minimum of 50% of the new property
- You can keep the 10% home loss payment or use this to buy a larger share in the new property. It's up to you
- If the value of your current home is less than 50% of the value of the new property; Swan will discuss with you what options are available. You may be asked to contribute part of your home loss payment to make up the value to 50%
- Swan will keep the remainder of the new property you don't buy and grant you a lease on it
- You will not pay any rent on the share of the property you do not own
- If in the future you'd like to sell your new property, proceeds from the sale will be divided between you and Swan. This will be calculated according to how much of the property each owns
- If you wish you will be able to buy future additional equity in the property in 10% shares up to 100%
- The shared equity ownership lease may be passed down to first generation direct relatives

New homes for Christmas!



Despite a few days of bad weather recently, work on the new homes on the former Fryerns school site is going well. Three of the blocks of houses are nearly finished and we're pleased to announce that the first block of rented homes is due to be completed and ready for the first residents of Beechwood Village to move into before Christmas. As



well as the first homes being finished, we'll be opening the first section of road onto the new area

of the estate (which goes past the show homes). This will be opened at the beginning of December and will provide access to the finished properties.



When we open the new road; the Ely Way exit on the Broadmayne roundabout, which leads to the Adult Community College Social Care, and Children's Centre site, will be closed and access to these will be through the new Beechwood Village exit on the roundabout.

Works on the internal areas of the remaining terraces of houses are continuing and many of these properties are due to be finished at the beginning of next year. As more properties are finished, we'll be opening up the new road until it joins up with the existing estate.

We are also progressing work to the roofs on the blocks of flats and when this is finished our contractors can start work on the internal areas.

Getting ready for the demolition

With works going well on the former Fryerns School site Swan will be looking to start demolishing empty properties on Phase 1 of the existing estate early next year.

To make sure that everything is ready we have made sure that all of the empty properties have had their heating systems, copper pipe work and all other items removed and service disconnections and meter removals for the properties are underway.

This timescale will be dependent on how the decant process progresses and may be subject to change. We will however, continue to keep you updated through our regular newsletters.

Secure tenants of Basildon Council will be rehoused in line with the Allocations Policy. We are currently concentrating on moving our tenants in Phase 1 of the redevelopment to either the new site if tenants wish to stay in the area or other areas in the Borough. With the new homes developed at Beechwood Village offering fantastic living areas and private rear gardens it is great to see that, despite property sales in general being very slow, we have already exchanged on 3 properties and have another 5 under offer.

Swan appreciates that buying a new home is difficult in the current market and that securing a mortgage can be a challenge and has therefore developed ezibuy - which allows purchasers to own 100% of your home for 85% of the cost.

Other options that could help you get on, or move up the property ladder are swanchoice - if you are a home owner on Phase 1 of the regeneration you could buy an equity share in a new property or partexchange - there are a few



options that could allow you to part exchange your existing property for a new home.

The Craylands Community Regeneration Group needs you!

We are looking for residents who want to get involved in the Craylands Regeneration Project and let us know their views.

The Community Regeneration Group currently has residents and representatives from Basildon Borough Council, Swan Housing Association, Higgins, the building contractor, the Homes and Communities Agency and the Police.

The Steering Group meets on a fortnightly and monthly basis to discuss matters relating to the regeneration project.

Some of the subjects regularly covered include:

- issues on site security
- progress of the project as a whole
- what will happen with compulsory purchase orders?
- what shared equity options are available to residents?

It is important that your views are heard; by joining the Community Regeneration Group there is a real opportunity for you to influence the future development of your homes and estate.

Urban Design Associates Update:

Architects, Urban Design Associates (UDA), visited Craylands in December 2010 to see if they could improve on the overall design of Phase 1.

Unfortunately, the icy conditions meant that it was difficult for people to get to the meetings. Now that the weather has improved however, Swan will be arranging a couple of additional meetings to give you the chance to see how the plans might change. The dates of these meetings will be announced soon and are open to everyone, not just those in Phase 1. Please come along and let us know what you think. What happens in Phase 1 will affect the designs of the next phases, so it is important that you let us know your views.

This is what you told us at the consultation events in December and how we've responded to your comments:

Community facilities and shops:

You were worried that the shops and Community Hall were due to be demolished under Phase 1 and permanent new facilities would not be reprovided until Phase 2.

To resolve this, the new proposed plans have been changed to include



the shops within the first part of Phase 1. They would be located in a building at the top of the EcoStrip (just off Peterborough Way).

Rear lanes and parking courts:

You were concerned that there was nowhere to store rubbish bags and wheelie bins if there was no rear access to the gardens of the new properties. You also wanted the rear of the new properties to be secure.

UDA have introduced rear lanes to the plans which provide access and on plot parking to all the properties. UDA have met with the Police Architectural Liaison Officer to make

sure the rear of properties are designed to be secure.

Accommodating existing buildings:

You were worried about how the new properties would relate to the existing buildings.

The proposed new plans create streets that have the fronts of properties facing each other across the street. Retained properties will also have rear access to their property.

Please note that the revised plans have not yet been approved by the Development Partners and may be subject to change.

Snow didn't stop the Craylands Activity Zone (CAZ) going ahead with its Christmas Party. The CAZ Club arranged for families and children, who regularly attend the school holidays club, to go along to Partyman World of Play.

Differences between Secure and Assured Tenancies

Following a number of queries raised by residents on the estate about secure and assured tenancies, we've prepared the table below which shows the main differences between the two types of tenancy. If you would like more information please call Gerry McDonnell on 0800 917 8909.

Tenancy Right	Secure Tenancy	Assured Tenancy
Amending the Tenancy Agreement	A Secure Tenancy can be amended by the Council following consultation with you. The Council does not need your agreement to amend the Tenancy Agreement.	An Assured Tenancy requires the Housing Association to get your approval before amending the terms of the Tenancy Agreement.
Right to Buy (RTB)	Tenants who have held their tenancy before 18th January 2005 can apply to buy their home now. People who became tenants after this date have to have held their tenancy for a minimum of five years. The maximum discount that tenants can receive is set at £34,000 off the sale price.	New tenants of a Housing Association would not have the RTB but would have the "Right to Acquire", which means that a tenant has the right to acquire a property but would receive a smaller discount, normally up to £16,000.
Right To Manage	As a Council tenant you have the right to collectively manage the homes on your estate and could set up a Tenant Management Organisation.	As an assured tenant you would no longer have this collective right. However, Housing Associations will usually be happy to establish a local management board with places for local tenants.
Succession Rights	As a Council tenant you have the ability to allow a successor, normally your next of kin or family member, to succeed your tenancy.	New tenants of the Housing Association would have a right of succession for a spouse or co-habitee.
Grounds for Possession	As a secure tenant all the grounds for possession are discretionary.	Under some circumstances, courts must give the Housing Association possession of the property if sought by the Association. These include if the tenant owes more than 8 weeks full rent. However, most Housing Associations use their discretion, in the same way as the Council does, as to whether or not to seek possession.

Keeping you updated

Over the last 2 months we have:

- Started work on stripping the first maisonette block so it's ready for demolition

Over the next 2 months we will be:

- Finishing demolition on the first maisonette block
- Demolishing the 1960s part of the former Fryerns School. Demolition of the remaining parts of the school will take place in September
- Preparing empty blocks of properties on Phase 1 of the existing estate for demolition
- Completing the first block of flats

What phase am I in?

Swan's architects held a number of open days and events in September where you highlighted some potential improvements to the existing master plan. These included bringing forward demolition of the maisonette blocks and changing the phasing to reduce the amount of disturbance caused to existing residents.

These potential changes have not yet been approved by the development partners and no changes have been made to the phasing.

We will hold more consultation events before any decisions are made so we can get your views on the proposed changes.

Below is an article from a resident who has found that by talking through her issues with us she is now looking forward to a moving to her new home.

“To be told in March 2006 that my house would be under a CPO, I felt sick and angry.

New homes for rent at Beechwood Village



Along with the homes that are for sale at Beechwood Village, 26 families have so far moved into the new Swan Housing rented homes with the flat blocks due to be completed over the next few weeks with some of these for rent and some shared ownership.

The Council has already moved a large number of permanent tenants who were living in Phase one, whose homes are to be demolished. They were given the opportunity to stay in the area and move to one of the new homes (subject to availability) or move to another area in the Borough.

The Allocations Team are progressing well with the Phase 1 decant and will continue to

decant permanent council tenants who need to move for the redevelopment. The Council have had many requests from tenants in the later Phases of the development to move but in order to progress the development in a timely manner and to be fair to all tenants we can only move tenants when their properties are needed for the redevelopment.

All permanent tenants who need to move in Phase 1 have been contacted.

Recycling from the demolition

Demolition of Fryerns School has started with the gym and food hall already demolished and work on the main block is under way. As the works progress lots of materials have been taken from the site and recycled. So far over 88% has been recycled; which is a great way to reduce the environmental impact of the development.

Other ways we are improving the environment on the estate is by making sure the new properties at Beechwood Village are energy efficient and that an EcoStrip is included



between Craylands and Montgomery Drive.

Careful management of the waste on site is really important and so far we've recycled 1314 tonnes of hardcore and 98 tonnes of metals.

Looking after the environment is an important part of the regeneration.

Empty Properties

Empty properties are a concern for many residents and are a concern for Swan too.

We make sure that all empty properties on the Estate are secured and use different deterrents which include, internal CCTV, signage, secure screens, and discrete alarms.

Residents, Basildon Borough Council, the Police and Swan staff regularly provide information about empty properties and following a recent update to procedures, Swan will securely board the remaining properties on Phase 1 soon after purchase.

If you notice any suspicious activity, anti-social behaviour or criminal damage at a vacant property please telephone the police immediately.

Depending on the urgency; you can contact the police on their non-emergency number which is 0300 333 4444 or you can contact them on their usual emergency number number.

Please remember that unauthorised access to a vacant property or building sites can be dangerous.

Why has the maisonette block not been demolished?

A number of problems have come up with the demolition of the maisonette block next to the shops. Swan and Basildon Borough Council are working hard to ensure that demolition takes place as soon as possible.

The delay is a result of several problems arising including the removal

of services taking longer than had been expected. For the removal to happen we need to work with all the energy suppliers and the national grid. We have been advised that this will take a few more weeks before this can be completed. Delay has also been caused by the soft strip taking much longer than expected, this has now been completed.

We are pleased to say that the demolition licence required from Basildon Borough Council is in place so that once the services are removed, demolition can begin.

Every effort is being made to ensure that demolition happens as soon as possible.

Regeneration Update

You may have seen misleading articles in the local press relating to works being carried out to empty properties in Rochester Way. Concerned residents have raised this with the Council and Swan and asked "what has happened to the regeneration project?"

"Due to changes to the phasing times of the demolition programme, we find we have properties that feature later than planned so we have decided to make use of some of them for temporary housing until their turn to be demolished comes around. This is common practice for us in these circumstances as it makes best use of the homes for the short time they have left. The demolition programme will not be held up in any way because of this."

Rab Fallon, Head of Housing at Basildon Council

The properties on Rochester Way are in sub-phase 1E of the regeneration project and will be the last part of phase 1 to be demolished. The demolition and re-building works will progress eastwards across the site, which is why sub-phase E is still being used by the Council. People moving into temporary properties will only be there until they are demolished. As the demolition and redevelopment gets closer to these properties the residents will be moved to alternative accommodation.

Over the last two months we have:

- Taken handover of Beechwood Village newly built flat Block
- Submitted the detailed planning application for Phase 1
- Taken reservations on the first flats for sale
- Continued working towards the first demolitions



- Arranged for the removal of the final meters from 39-63 Norwich Walk
- Completed the demolition of Fryerns School

Over the next two months we plan to:

- Hear from Basildon's Planning Department about the Phase 1 Planning Application
- Complete the removal of services to 39-63 Norwich Walk

Demolition Update

Demolition of the 39-63 Norwich Walk maisonette block is well under way and will be completed by Christmas. Preparations for the demolition of other vacant blocks is progressing well.

Why are we waiting for another Planning Permission?

Some residents have questioned why Swan recently submitted another planning application. The current application is for the detailed design of Phase 1 C-F. It replaces and improves on an older detailed planning application made for the whole of Phase 1. These improvements have been developed following consultation with residents and including ideas from other successful regeneration schemes.

The detailed planning application sets out Swan's complete plans for the phase, these are a lot more detailed than the outline planning permission. The master plan, or outline planning as it is also referred to, is less detailed but covers a wider area and commits to general ideas and principles on the regeneration project.

Planning Decision

There have been some delays to the Planning process, which unfortunately means that we do not



expect a decision to be made until the New Year. We now anticipate receiving a planning committee date in mid-January. This meeting will be where the decision is made. Swan is confident that the planning application will be approved and will

keep you informed with any new developments.

Look out for the planning decision in the press and the February 2012 Craylands and Beechwood Village Newsletter. Keep your fingers crossed for a positive result!

Swan Housing Association, Basildon Borough Council and the Homes and Communities Agency are delighted to confirm that the delivery of the next phase of works 1 C-F has commenced and that all buy outs have been completed.

Pre-construction work started in mid-March and was as follows:

- House clearances to Norwich Walk 56-64 and 44-54 and Craylands 126-138, 140-146 and 148-154
- Asbestos cleared in Norwich Walk 56-44 and Craylands 126-138
- Completion of tree removal
- Service disconnections to empty units

Demolition work is due to start at the beginning of May 2013. Construction of the new retail units and community hall will be the the first new construction to commence. Asbestos Surveys were completed by mid February 2013 as scheduled.

An Information Day was held at the Adult Community Learning Centre on the 16th March 2013 which was open to all residents and well attended. The purpose of the event was to provide an open forum where residents could come and talk to the development partners and the project architect to voice any concerns.

A phasing plan was on display, so that residents could identify the future phases which will follow in the overall regeneration of Craylands.

We would like to thank the members of the Craylands and Beechwood Residents Group who attended and were able to assist in answering residents' questions.

We are delighted to advise that the "Craylands and Fryerns" regeneration development has been designated as one of the Top 100 Regeneration Projects by an independent body and publicised on the Planning and Regeneration and Renewable

websites. Craylands was placed at number 70, against high profile competition from projects such as "Queen Elizabeth Olympic Park" and "Wembley City".

Works Update

Residents can now see positive progress as the regeneration of this phase moves forward. The demolition is 90% complete and the next phase of construction is well underway (see photo).

The first properties completed will provide new shops and a temporary community hall. The hall will be in use until a permanent hall can be provided in the following phase of construction post 2015.

The first homes completed will be mainly apartments with houses following on shortly afterwards. The whole of the current phase is due to be completed during 2015.

Development Update

Residents can now see positive progress as the first sub-phase continues. The frames for the new Commercial Units and Community Hall have been erected and construction of the flats above these units has begun. The residential accommodation in this area will provide 35 homes in total. Overall phase 1c to 1f will deliver 206 units, these will include 149 properties available for social rent, 4 shared ownership and 53 private sale properties.

Work on the rest of the site is focusing on utility diversions, disconnections and new supplies together with drainage diversions and the foundations.

The remaining existing structures which include the main shop block and former consultation shop, has had asbestos surveys completed and demolition will commence shortly.

It's great to see this progress, however, the wet weather and service diversions has had an adverse effect on the programme and it is now

envisaged that the first sub-phase will be available in August 2014.

Swan Housing Association is working closely with Basildon Borough Council to ensure that all residents on the scheme are kept up to date.

Site Update

Swan Housing Association are delighted that Craylands residents can now see the new shops and community facilities and the first new homes taking shape. However, we know that the regeneration work is affecting residents and we continue to listen to feedback we receive from residents who pop in to the Consultation Shop and also from the Residents Group. Here is an update on some of the issues raised recently...

Muddy Roads and Footpaths:

We know that the roads and footpaths were very muddy in January and apologise to residents. The wet weather is making it really difficult to keep the mud on the construction site. Swan New Homes, the contractor, now has a dedicated road sweeper working to keep the paths and roads clear and is ensuring wheels are jet washed before lorries leave the site. Residents have told us this has already made a difference but we are monitoring this situation closely.



Royal Mail Post Box:

To enable us to make the site secure, Swan New Homes have had to fence in the Post Box after it had been emptied and secured by Royal Mail. We are now working with the Residents Group to identify an alternative site for the Post Box – watch this space!

Telephone Box:

Like the Post Box, the telephone box has been fenced in. However, we are working with British Telecom to get the telephone box moved to an alternative site as soon as possible.

Road and Footpath Closures:

Some of the estate roads and footpaths and parking areas have now been closed off. This has been approved by the Department of Transport and the emergency services through a “Stopping Up” order process granted to Swan.



We are working closely with the Residents Group to make sure there are the signs and information residents need to be able to get around the estate during the works is in place.

Latest update on the regeneration of Craylands



Rab Fallon

Rab Fallon, Corporate Specialist at Basildon Borough Council, provides an update on how the partners expect this project to proceed.

As you may know, the Craylands regeneration project is planned over 4 phases that stretch over a number of years. While the project has experienced a number of delays, mostly caused by the economic downturn and the subsequent recession, phase 1 of the project is currently progressing well and due to be completed during 2015.

We are now taking a number of steps to try and speed up the regeneration process. It is our intention that Phases 2 and 3 will be rolled out simultaneously between 2015 and 2019. These are currently being designed and a planning application will be submitted in due course. Initial financial assessments of these phases are positive so we are hopeful that these timescales are achievable.

Work on Phase 4 was originally expected to start in 2018 but, in an attempt to bring some of this phase forward, the

partners recently submitted a bid to the Local Enterprise Partnership for funding. This funding bid was highlighted by local media who suggested that the regeneration project is in danger.

We wish to reassure residents that this is not the case and, if this funding bid is successful, we will begin work on some of Phase 4 earlier than scheduled. If the bid is unsuccessful we will seek alternatives or continue with the current timetable. It is normal practice to secure funding for future phases of regeneration projects at different times.

In the meantime, Council and Housing Association applications from tenants living in phase 2, who have told Basildon Borough Council they would like to be rehoused on the estate are being assessed. The assessments will be completed by March 2015, as the new housing in phase 1 is finished.

Other phase 2 tenants will have their applications considered after that. Homeowners in phase 2 will be invited to discuss the purchase of their properties at the appropriate times.

Progress report on the construction work



As you can see, the redevelopment works are continuing and work has now begun on the new main road which will run through the estate. Peterborough Way has now been closed to vehicles (although a pedestrian route remains) to allow some of the work to be completed.

You should now be able to see progress on both sides of Peterborough Way, especially with the foundation work and timber frame construction. Inside some of the properties work has now begun on plaster boarding and electrical installation.



At the Lincoln Road end of the site work has now begun on the new sales suite.

Changes to Jobseekers Allowance



There are changes to Jobseekers Allowance from the 28th April 2014 that may affect you. You must comply with these changes otherwise you may not receive Jobseekers Allowance.

To make register a new claim for Jobseekers Allowance you must:

- Set up an email address
- Prepare a CV
- Register for Universal Jobmatch

If you make a new claim on-line this must be done to enable you to register. If you make your claim over the phone your work coach can help you.

It will become compulsory to receive training if your English language skills are below Entry Level 2 and your Jobseekers Allowance may be stopped if you do not attend the training.

If you claim Income Support as a lone parent there are further changes and you may have to attend work-focused interviews. The interviews are compulsory and your benefit may be stopped if you do not attend.

Regeneration update: New homes handed over



We are pleased that work to complete homes in the current phase is progressing well and residents have been moving in on a weekly basis. As blocks are handed over you will notice the line of the construction site fence changing to allow for access.

Most external works are being completed once each area is handed over, with the exception of some landscaping, pathway and road / diversion works which will be completed later in the year once all of the approvals are in place.

Construction activity is beginning to focus on Phase 1E. It is expected that these homes will be completed in Summer 2016.

Architects have now been appointed and briefed for future phases and a detailed infrastructure strategy is being considered in more detail. Swan are aware that the interface between the new and retained areas needs careful planning with extra consideration given to roads, footpaths and parking.

More detail in relation to the timing of the planning phase will be provided as it is available and a consultation event is planned for later this year.

Swan Estate Services on Beechwood Village



Swan's Estate Services and Hera are responsible for maintaining all communal areas, inside and out, on Beechwood Village. They ensure the blocks are maintained to the high standards we expect - e.g. now that most residents have moved in, floors in communal areas have been sealed and polished.

In Swan blocks, the block cleaning schedules, cleaning standards and a photograph of the person responsible for cleaning are clearly displayed on the noticeboards in ground floor lobby areas. Hera residents can call 0345 683 8812 if they would like this information for their blocks.

We ask that residents help us to keep the blocks and surrounding

Consultation Update



Swan and Basildon Borough Council recently held an Information Day for residents of Craylands and Beechwood Village giving them the opportunity to meet the Project team from Swan and Basildon Council.

More than 40 residents came along in December to ask questions, discuss the proposed demolition plans and to find out how they may be affected.

Swan's Development team and representatives from their architects, Pollard Thomas Edwards, were on hand to talk about the plans for proposed phases 2&4 North and phases 2&4 South.

Residents also took part in a feedback exercise, completing a feedback form and mapping out the locations of their properties from the plans and answering questions about how they currently use the estate.

Project Update



NU living continue working to complete the 53 homes remaining in the current phase.

Works are also being done to complete the external and environmental works surrounding the homes that have already been completed. Some of this work requires the approval of various agencies so the project team are continuing to work together to ensure it is all completed as soon as possible.

NU living are now starting to work on the future phases of the regeneration project. The details for these phases are still in the development phase and you have

Following these events we are now working to finalise the planning application for the north, south and west phases of the redevelopment. We expect that this will be submitted to Basildon Council at the end of May.

Wherever possible the designs being developed reflect your feedback from the consultation process, based on your feedback the final scheme will include:

- Demolition of all but one of the maisonette blocks
- Traffic calming measures
- A more logical road layout
- Reorganised parking arrangements to maximise

spaces near existing homes and additional parking for Peterborough Way and Lincoln Road

- Improved safety around the site including better lighting around the estate
- Improvements to green spaces and communal areas
- Work to make the Swale area more usable for everyone
- A new community hub including play facilities (see Landscape Architect's sketch above)
- Improved access to local parks and amenities with new pedestrian routes through the estate

A public exhibition of the final scheme will be held at the new Community Centre, next to the shop, from Wednesday 18 May

Tackling Anti-Social Behaviour in Beechwood



We are committed to tackling issues relating to anti-social behaviour (ASB), harassment and neighbour nuisance. We take all incidents of ASB very seriously, working quickly to resolve any problems.

Anti-social behaviour can include a wide range of unacceptable behaviours including noise nuisance, such as loud music, dogs barking and shouting, through to more serious acts such as the use of threatening behaviour, domestic violence or hate crimes.

To report ASB during office hours please call the Essex Neighbourhood team on 0300 303 2500. To report an incident outside office hours call the Police number 101. People wishing to report ASB should now use the Police 101 number as they are the lead agency for ASB. The Police may refer certain items to the Council or Register Social Landlord for further action, but in the first instance the problem should be looked into and dealt with by the Police.

Examples of things that can be reported to 101 are:

- Nuisance, rowdy or inconsiderate neighbours.
- Vandalism, graffiti and fly-posting.
- Buying or selling of drugs in public.
- Street drinking.
- Prostitution related activity.
- Environmental damage including littering, dumping of rubbish and abandonment of cars.
- Begging and vagrancy.
- Fireworks misuse.
- Inconsiderate or inappropriate use of vehicles.

101 can also be used to report a crime that has already happened or to seek crime prevention advice.

Always call 999 when a crime is happening, someone suspected of a crime is nearby, someone is injured, being threatened or in danger.

What's coming up throughout 2017

Winter 2016/17


As residents will be aware we have started works on the West Phase with the site now hoarded and roads and drainage work due to commence shortly.



Improvements to Council Properties

Morgan Sindall are working in partnership with Basildon Council on a programme of works to improve Council properties on the estate. The works will focus on improving the external and internal wall cladding of the properties.

It is expected that these works will reduce the need for repairs, improve the thermal efficiency of the homes and reduce energy bills for residents.

Landscaping and Highway works to Hereford Walk

Basildon Borough Council, in partnership with Essex County Council, have been carrying out further Highway and Landscaping Improvement works in Hereford Walk.

The works have included upgrades to the footpaths and works on the trees. The tree work has seen the removal of low value trees which have been replaced with sapling trees, native to the estate.

The Council are continuing to invest and plan to carry out further landscaping improvements to the retained areas across the whole of the Craylands estate. Watch this space for further updates!

Garage Demolition

In recent weeks several garage blocks across the estate have been demolished.

It was decided to demolish the garages earlier this year because of the high levels of anti-social behaviour in these areas.

In the coming months Basildon Borough Council, in partnership with Essex County Council, will carry out highway improvement works to the demolished areas that will increase safety for pedestrians and vehicles.

Swan's innovative factory is making waves!



The new homes currently being constructed on the Beechwood West phase are an innovation for the British construction industry. Swan Housing Association is the first housing association in the UK to have its own modular housing factory which opened recently in Basildon and has created up to forty jobs for local people.

The innovative factory is making waves throughout the housing and construction industry. It champions modern methods of construction which will help to speed up the delivery of much needed housing in Basildon and beyond.

The factory-built homes are precision engineered from cross laminated timber (CLT). The modules are delivered to site with flooring, kitchens and bathrooms already completed. They are then covered in a brick skin on site.

This method of construction means that there is less disruption to residents living around the development area. It is also more sustainable as there is a significant reduction in construction waste - the off-cuts of CLT are even used to heat the factory!

Natalie Elphicke OBE, Chief Executive of The Housing and Finance Institute recently visited the factory and the Beechwood showhomes alongside a number of VIP guests including Stephen Metcalfe MP for South Basildon and East Thurrock (see picture above). After her visit Natalie commented:

"Built in Basildon and its brilliant!"

Compulsory Purchase Order Update

As you may have seen in the news recently, Basildon Council has received approval to make a Compulsory Purchase Order in respect of the properties located in the Northern phase of the Craylands Estate regeneration.

Development Partners Swan Housing Association and Basildon Borough Council have already contacted all leaseholders and homeowners whose property we need to acquire for the regeneration. So far we have successfully negotiated the purchase of 11 homes and we continue to engage with the remaining owners to secure the purchase of the remaining properties.

The following addresses in the Northern phase are affected by the Compulsory Purchase Order. There will be more demolition work in the Southern phase of the regeneration and we will inform affected homeowners in due course:

Fire Safety

Fire safety is everyone's responsibility and we all need to do our bit to keep each other safe. We would like everyone to understand Swan's fire safety procedures and rules about obstructing corridors and walkways in blocks of flats.

General Advice

- Close all internal doors when you go to bed.
- Take care in the kitchen, never leave your cooking unattended and take extra care with hot oil.
- Never leave lit candles unattended.
- Make sure cigarettes are stubbed out and disposed of carefully and never smoke in bed.
- Don't overload electrical sockets.
- Keep matches away from children.
- Do not store flammable liquids such as petrol in your home, bin store or chutes.

Fire Advice for Blocks of Flats

Your building, like many residential buildings, is designed to restrict the spread of fire and smoke between flats. This means it will usually be safe for you to stay in your own flat if a fire breaks out elsewhere. Because of this we have specific advice on what to do to keep everyone safe.

If a fire breaks out in another part of your purpose built block:

Stay put until the fire service says it's safe to leave.

- Call the Fire Service on 999 and let them know where you are so they can find you.
- You should only leave immediately if smoke or heat affects your home or if you are told to by the fire service.
- If you leave, close the front door.
- If there is a lift do not use it.
- Wait outside, away from the building.

If a fire breaks out in your home

- Leave the room where the fire is straight away and close the door.
- Tell everyone in your home to leave immediately.
- Close the front door.
- Do not stay behind to put the fire out.
- If there is a lift - do not use it.
- Call the fire service - dial 999.
- Wait outside, away from the building.

Obstructions in corridors and balconies can hinder emergency evacuation

- Items placed in the corridor and on window sills must be made of materials that will not burn easily, e.g. metal, ceramic, porcelain and must not cause an obstruction or hazard of any type.
- Permanent or heavy furniture and constructions are not allowed.
- Portable chairs, clothes dryers and the like **are** allowed.
- Fixed washing lines are not allowed.
- Bicycles, pushchairs etc are not allowed.
- Hazardous items including plastic storage sheds are not allowed.
- Balconies should not be used to store a large amounts of material and must never be used to store flammable material.

Universal Credit - We Are Here To Help



Universal Credit has now been 'rolled out' across the whole country and Basildon is now a 'full service' area.

There are over 900 Swan residents who currently claim Universal Credit and approximately 50 more join them every month.

Universal Credit is intended to be simpler. It is a single monthly payment that replaces six legacy benefits:

- **Income Support**
- **Employment and Support Allowance**
- **Job Seekers Allowance**
- **Child Tax Credit**
- **Working Tax Credit**
- **Housing Benefits**

Anyone who lives in Basildon who needs to make a new claim for any of these six benefits, will now have to make an online claim for Universal Credit instead.

Universal Credit is only paid once a month, so anyone who receives it, must budget their money monthly.

This can be difficult to get used to but, if done correctly, can actually save money.

Most residents who receive Universal Credit will receive money for their housing costs directly so they are responsible for paying their rent themselves.

Pensioners aren't affected and unless their circumstances change, people of working age who currently receive the old (legacy) benefits have not been transferred to Universal Credit.

If you are affected, know someone who is affected or would just like some more information, help, hints and tips please contact our Welfare Team. It's never too late (or too early!) to start preparing for Universal Credit so ACT NOW!


their thoughts with Swan. The results of the survey are still being analysed but, the overall response was very positive, and we look forward to holding more events like this in the future.
