BACKSIDE TO TRACKSIDE PROGRAMME BECOMES AWARD WINNING!

Our Backside to Trackside programme supported over 200 residents get active in 2021, and its success was recognised by winning two active awards.

Backside to Trackside is a free nine-week programme run by the council and supported by Everyone Active and Active Basildon, to help residents develop the skills to walk, run or jog five kilometres around the athletics track at Basildon Sporting Village.

The programme would normally run once a year, but it's popularity meant we ran a successful Autumn edition in 2021 on top of our Summer programme, to be able to support as many residents as possible.

In addition to helping hundreds of residents, the programme won the Active Wellbeing Award at both the Basildon and Essex Activity Awards!

Chairman of the Leisure and Environment Committee Councillor Craig Rimmer said: "Backside to Trackside is such a great programme for our borough. It brings people from all corners of the borough together and creates one big community of residents, all supporting each other to achieve their fitness goals.

"Having cheered on our residents at the Fun Run events to conclude the two programmes in 2021, I've seen first-hand how much fun all the participants have, and also the real sense of achievement felt when they complete it and get their medal. I look forward to cheering the next cohort on in 2022."



BASILDON COUNCIL HAVING ELECTORAL REVIEW

The local government boundary commission is conducting a periodic review looking at how Basildon Council is made up in terms of the total number of councillors and representation across borough wards.

The first part of the review is to look at how many councillors should represent the borough. Recommendations to the commission will be made by the council using a national formula and is based on future population predictions. The commission will then decide whether that number delivers effective representation and effective decision making. Following this, the boundary commission will look at the boundaries and makeup of the various wards in the borough.

There will be two opportunities for residents to get involved. Consultations will run from the 10 May to 18 July 2022, then subsequently on the draft proposals 4 October to 12 December 2022. The final proposals will be published on the 28 February 2023 and if required there will be further consultation. The proposals then need to be approved by parliament. Should they be approved the new arrangements will be implemented at elections in May 2024.

BOROUGH CELEBRATIONS ORGANISED FOR QUEEN'S PLATINUM JUBILEE

A range of celebratory activities have been agreed as part of Her Majesty the Queen's Platinum Jubilee this year.

Activities include the lighting of beacons, Big Jubilee Lunches and the planting of tree circles as part of the Queen's Green Canopy in borough parks across the five towns.

Chairman of the Communities and Wellbeing Committee Councillor Terri Sargent said: "Her Majesty ascended to the throne on 6 February 1952 and no other monarch has reigned for 70 years so this is truly a once in a generation event and we plan to mark the occasion accordingly with a host of community focused events in our public parks."

Beacons will be lit across five of the borough's parks, Wat Tyler Country Park, Pitsea, Sun Corner, Billericay, Pound Lane, Laindon, Wickford Memorial Park, Wickford and Basildon's Gloucester Park.

The beacons will be lit alongside others in ceremonies up and down the country at 9.45pm and will be preceded by speeches, prayer and music on Thursday 2 June.

The extended bank holiday weekend will be from Thursday 2 to Sunday 5 June 2022.

The council will work with community groups in the five towns to organise free Big Jubilee Lunches in parks. This would involve decorating an area of the park for people to bring picnics and providing entertainment.



Tree circles will also be planted in each of the five towns at South Green Open Space, Nevendon Road Recreation Ground, Victoria Park, Gloucester Park and Northlands Park. The tree circles will be planted with Prunus Kanzan (double pink cherry) so that in future years there will be a circle of blossom in the Spring.

Following the planting of the trees commemorative plaques will be placed at the circles during the celebratory weekend in June this year.

LOCAL INNOVATOR GROUND CONTROL IS RECOGNISED WITH THE QUEEN'S AWARD FOR ENTERPRISE

An innovative Billericay-based construction and maintenance contractor has been recognised with the Queen's Award for Enterprise. Ground Control is one of the only companies in the UK to have won the prestigious Queen's Award for Enterprise, twice in five years.

The company has been recognised for their use of technology including in communities in Basildon and across the UK.

Jason Knights, Managing Director at Ground Control, said: "This award is recognition of our efforts and investment in making external spaces functional, safe, and enjoyable for all. PUBLIC SPACES PROTECTION ORDER COULD BE INTRODUCED LATER THIS MONTH

A Public Spaces Protection Order (PSPO) covering the borough could be introduced after overwhelming support from residents in a recent public consultation.

A PSPO is a legal order to tackle anti-social behaviour (ASB) that would cover specific restricted areas within the borough such as parks and town centres, and the breaching of it is a criminal offence which could be subject to a fine on prosecution (up to £1,000).

The activities that a potential PSPO would give authorised officers of the council powers to enforce relate to alcohol and substance use, urination and defecation, pony and traps, motor vehicles, and car cruising. At least 85% of residents supported introducing a PSPO to tackle each individual activity, with the large majority being in strong support for each.

The decision on whether to implement a borough-wide PSPO will be made by councillors at the upcoming Full Council meeting on Friday 24 March.

Leader of Basildon Council and Chairman of the Public Order and Enforcement Committee Councillor Andrew Baggott said: "A PSPO covering the borough would give us more powers to tackle the behaviour that we don't want to see in Basildon.

"Our enforcement teams and park wardens already do brilliant work across the borough, and the introduction of a PSPO would allow us to utilise and strengthen these resources to do even more to make our borough a nicer place to live."

The awards ceremony took place at Fords Social Club, hosted by the Mayor of Basildon, Councillor David Dadds.

Councillor David Dadds said: "Volunteers are such a vital cog in the mechanics of our borough. They give up their time to do such selfless work across Basildon.

"I'm delighted that we were able to put these awards on this year and shine a light on some of the amazing individuals who really deserve a light being shone on them.

"It was an honour to be able to meet the nominees and winners personally and thank them for their efforts to make our borough a better place."



SMALL CHANGES BIG IMPACT

Separating food and garden waste can make a big impact on climate change. Climate change is an issue that continues to grab headlines across the globe but it is locally where we can all make a difference and there are so many ways we can do it.

This Autumn, Basildon Council will be implementing change to its waste and recycling services. Following a public consultation in 2021 in which more than 7,000 borough residents responded, councillors agreed proposals to separate food and garden waste.

Here's how the service will work:

Each household will receive a weekly food waste collected via electric vehicles. Households will be provided with a 23-litre and a 5-litre kitchen caddy for indoor use, and 50 kitchen caddy liners annually to each property free of charge.

Households will receive a fortnightly, free of charge garden waste collection, collected via your current green wheelie bins (or garden waste sacks).

Chairman of the Leisure and Environment Committee Councillor Craig Rimmer said: "We have been set clear targets by The Circular Economy Package, which commit the UK to achieve a recycling rate of 65% by 2035, an ambition we have adopted in Basildon."



Nationally, the revised Waste Strategy for England and the Environment Bill are also aiming to radically change how waste is reduced, reused and recycled.

This will affect the way in which local authorities collect and treat waste. The Environment Act states that food and garden waste must be collected separately from homes and businesses from 2023. Because of this there are fewer places which will be able to accept mixed food and garden waste in the future.

FOOD WASTE FACTS

When food waste is thrown away via your black sacks, it ends up in landfill, where it emits harmful greenhouse gases to the atmosphere and contributes to global warming. Recycling food waste produces fertiliser, compost, renewable energy and reduces harm to the environment.

Wasted household food alone is responsible for 21 million tonnes of CO₂e and even if you only count the edible food wasted, it comes to a total of 14 million tonnes.

If we eradicated those 14 million tonnes, it would be the equivalent of taking one in five cars off the road.

Sophia Stancer, Loungers, said: "The new Lounge in Basildon is open and we are looking forward to connecting with locals via fundraising projects for local causes and generally being a hub for community groups for their meet-ups.

"A community noticeboard is available for those wanting to publicise events and a book swap area will be kept well stocked. The team will also be holding regular fundraising events as part of their commitment to making a difference in the community."

£10 MILLION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAMME FOR ESTATES

A multi-million pound investment in our borough's estates is set to get underway this year following the work of our Pride Teams - which has already been making a difference.

Proposals to invest millions into creating clean and safe neighbourhoods were agreed by the council's Housing and Estate Renewal Committee last year when the 'Safe and Sound' programme was approved.

It was agreed that Felmores, Lee Chapel North and Five Links would be in the first wave of the programme.

From November last year through to January this year, the council's teams were on the Five Links estate de-weeding, deep cleaning, clearing shrubbery from walkways and alleys and removing graffiti and dumping. More than 126 courtyards were revamped as part of the programme. More than 35 tonnes of waste including debris and dumping has been cleared from the estate and the teams have cleared 22 blocked paved areas, 14 alleyways and a play area with more planned.

The council's contractors also spent some time on the Chalvedon estate carrying out tree surgery to clear sight lines and make the estate safer.

Committee Chairman Councillor Andrew Schrader said: “For too long this has not been the case in some of the borough’s neighbourhoods, so when we came into administration we made a commitment to listen to our residents and address their concerns.

Throughout, we will remain committed to listening to residents and their priorities will guide everything we do.”

It is anticipated that this programme will require an investment of £10 million a year over the next four years.





SEPARATE FOOD & GARDEN WASTE COLLECTIONS COMING SOON

Food waste makes up over a third of what goes to landfill in Basildon – this has a massive impact on the borough's recycling rate and carbon footprint.

We are introducing a separate collection of all food waste to help reduce this impact.

Food and garden waste will be collected separately from Autumn 2022. You will receive new containers to separate your food waste for collection.

The Covid-19 pandemic has continued to have a significant financial impact on the council and the services we provide our residents. But thanks to sound, effective management of our resources we have been able to agree a balanced budget for 2022/23 and deliver a freeze on the Basildon Council portion of your Council Tax for the year.

It is important to remember that 71 per cent of the Council Tax we pay goes straight to Essex County Council, and a further 15 per cent goes to the police and fire services.

Despite the Council Tax freeze, we are continuing with and adding to an ambitious programme of investment and projects to improve the lives and environment of the people of the borough.

Highlights of our investment plans include funding for community wardens to disrupt drug-dealing in your estates and communities; a freeze on car parking charges on Billericay and Wickford High Streets; funding to complete the renovation of the Laindon Community Centre; and funding to complete plans for a new swimming pool in Pitsea. Real investment in the areas you have told us you want to see, as we continue to put you at the heart of everything we do.

OUR BIGGEST TREE PLANTING PROJECT THIS CENTURY

The council's biggest tree planting project this century has taken place in and around Gloucester Park.

A massive 12,700 trees have been planted in a three-week project, with the help of hundreds of volunteers from the community, local businesses and council staff.

Our parks team were there bright and early to welcome volunteers each morning at the team's Sporting Village car park base, giving daily group demonstrations, handing out all the necessary equipment, and more importantly... providing a space for free tea, coffee, and biscuits throughout the day.

Sustainability - The trees have all been planted sustainably, by using composted mulch at the base of each tree to help it settle, and improving drainage and making it more moisture retentive.

FORD AT DUNTON

Ford has been operating locally at their Dunton base for over 50 years. Lee, and Marlena are part of the company's Manufacturing Engineering Team who got involved in the planting as their team's volunteering project.

"I've never planted trees before but it's felt really worthwhile, I think the whole team are enjoying being part of it." - Lee

BROWN AND CARROLL

Brown and Carroll is a specialist joinery firm who house over 150 employees at their Basildon base. The firm donated a portion of the trees planted, and also got involved in the planting too.

"Many years ago, we made a serious commitment to plant six trees for every single cubic metre of timber we use. So, we're delighted to be donating the trees required for the Big Basildon tree planting project," said Paul Carroll, Managing Director.

GET TO KNOW TONY FROM THE WICKFORD WOMBLES

REDISCOVERING BASILDON

From a population of 157 to an economic powerhouse of the 21st century!

It's hard to believe that Basildon had humble beginnings as a small rural village with a population of just 157 in 1869. Fast forward little over 150 years and the town has grown into an economic powerhouse playing host to a number of international firms like Case New Holland, Leonardo and Costa Coffee.

It was in 1948 that the Rt. Hon. Lewis Silkin said: "Basildon will become a city which people from all over the world will want to visit. It will be a place where all classes of community can meet freely together on equal terms and enjoy common cultural recreational facilities."

He spoke those words as the Minister of Town and Country Planning in Clement Attlee's post war Labour Government at a packed public meeting in Laindon School in September 1948. Just four months later on 4 January 1949 Basildon was officially designated a 'new town'. The first new residents arrived in 1951 and the rest, as they say, is history.

Basildon borough is now one of the most densely populated areas in the county, with a population of around 180,000.

It is also a town synonymous with the arts and became the first town in Essex to receive an Arts Council England Creative People and Places grant. However, it was in the 1980s that it first came to the fore as a hotbed of musical talent. Both Alison Moyet and Depeche Mode hail from Basildon. Fans of Depeche Mode still visit the town to retrace their footsteps.



Along with its cultural credentials Basildon can now also boast a sporting legacy. The Basildon Sporting Village, which was opened in 2011, was used as a training base by the Japanese swimming team during the London 2012 Olympic Games.

Since then, it has also become the home to South Essex Gymnastics Club where six-time Olympic medallist Max Whitlock trains. He won the most recent of his three gold medals at the Tokyo Olympics.

It was opened on Friday 12 March 1999 by Her Majesty the Queen. All the bells were cast at the Whitechapel Bell foundry in East London over 500 years ago.





A CONVERSATION WITH... Community Engagement Officers at Basildon Council

Daniel, Jane, Ramneet and Sophie make up the Community Engagement Team at Basildon Council. Their role centres around helping the most vulnerable in our communities get access to the support they need. We met with the team to find out more about their work and how you can get in touch.

Tell us a bit about your role.

We help vulnerable customers get access to the services and support they need. That might be financial and debt support, help developing skills and getting into work, mental health support, or simply helping customers apply for and claim the right benefits. And if we can't help them directly, we put them in touch with the people who can.

We work with local partners like the Probation Service and the NHS to identify individuals who could benefit from extra support. We previously found our customers through internal referrals, but we know that there are many more people out there who we may be able to help.

What kind of support do you provide?

Our main aim is to help people get back into work, but it's not just about employment. Sometimes people can get stuck in a rut, and it's hard to see a way out. It can take time to sort through these issues, so we spend time building a relationship with each customer, putting them at ease and supporting them until they are back on their feet.

We join the dots between the customer and support available to them. That might mean helping with a benefits application or talking to other agencies on their behalf. We can alleviate some of the pressure customers may be feeling so they can take control of their lives again.
