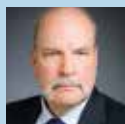

BOROUGH CELEBRATIONS FOR QUEEN'S PLATINUM JUBILEE

The borough rejoiced in celebration for the Queen's Platinum Jubilee across the extended bank holiday weekend (2-5 June).

Activities included the lighting of Beacons, Big Jubilee Lunches and the planting of tree circles as part of the Queen's Green Canopy in borough parks across the five towns.

Mayor of Basildon, Councillor Luke Mackenzie, commented "What a wonderful weekend of activities to pay tribute to our Queen who ascended to the throne on 6 February 1952. No other monarch has reigned for 70 years so this was truly a once in a generation event."

Beacons were lit at 9.45pm in each of the following locations on Thursday 2 June:

- Basildon – Gloucester Park
- Wickford – Wickford Memorial Park
- Laindon – Paddocks Community Hall, Pound Lane
- Pitsea – Wat Tyler Country Park

Each beacon lighting ceremony was attended by members of the public and local dignitaries. The events included speeches, prayer commemorating the Jubilee and thanksgiving for HM The Queen's long service. The ceremonies also included the playing of pipes and drums piece 'Diu Regnare', the playing of the bugle called 'Her Majesty' and the choral piece 'Song for the Commonwealth' as the beacons were being lit.

The council also worked with community groups and parish councils to organise free Big Jubilee Lunches on Sunday 5 June.

This involved decorating parks to bring celebrations into the heart of the community for people to bring picnics and enjoy live entertainment.



THE QUEEN'S GREEN CANOPY

The Queen's Green Canopy is a UK wide tree planting initiative created to mark Her Majesty's Platinum Jubilee by inviting people to plant a tree for the Jubilee. The council marked this by creating five commemorative tree circles across the borough:

Billericay – South Green Open Space

Wickford – Nevendon Road Recreation Ground

Basildon – Gloucester Park

Laindon – Victoria Park

Pitsea – Northlands Park

The trees are all *Prunus Avium's* - a beautiful, pink leafed species of cherry tree, and 66 have been planted across the five locations.

Plaques to commemorate the occasion will be installed at each location, with the unveiling ceremonies at each of the five locations taking place later this year.

D-DAY VETERAN DON SHEPPARD HONOURED ON 102ND BIRTHDAY

Legendary Basildon resident Don Sheppard turned 102-years old earlier in May, and the milestone was recognised with a special event at Buttsbury Junior School.

The D-Day veteran who incredibly defended our country, visited the school alongside the Mayor of Basildon for a ceremony with over 500 students paying their tributes to a hero of our borough.

The Mayor of Basildon said a few words, before Don was presented with a cake by the students, and an apple tree was planted by the group in the grounds of the school.

The tree is coupled with a commemorative plaque, dated the 4th May 2022, explaining that the tree was planted to honour both Don's 102nd birthday and to celebrate the Queen's Platinum Jubilee.

Don is one of four people, including Olympic star Max Whitlock, who have been granted Freedom of Entry to the Borough in recent years – and for your sacrifice, your bravery, and the example you set for us all, we salute you!

TRIBUTE TO MARK THE HISTORIC OCCASION OF THE PLATINUM JUBILEE

Basildon's rich cultural heritage has been added to in the form of a new permanent display of public art in the town centre. A Bronze relief of HM The Queen is already taking pride of place on the outside of The Basildon Centre, being designed locally by born and bred Basildon sculptor Aden Hynes.

The unveiling of the sculpture and the associated commemorative plaque took place on Monday 30 May, being unveiled by The Lord Lieutenant of Essex in a ceremony with councillors and residents in attendance.



QUEEN'S BATON RELAY TO VISIT BASILDON

On Friday 8 July, Basildon will officially welcome the Baton as part of the final journey of the Queen's Baton Relay.

Birmingham 2022 is hosting the 16th official Queen's Baton Relay - a journey which brings together and celebrates communities across the Commonwealth during the build up to the Games. In England, the Queen's Baton Relay will provide the opportunity for communities to experience the excitement for Birmingham 2022, as the 11 days of showstopping sport draws ever closer.

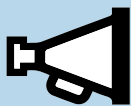
The Queen's Baton Relay is set to travel the length and breadth of England for a total of 29 days, before culminating with the Opening Ceremony for Birmingham 2022 on 28 July 2022. Kicking off on Thursday 2 June, the Baton spent four days in London, coinciding with the Queen's Platinum Jubilee Weekend. The Baton will then resume the international journey and return to England on Monday 4 July to commence a 25-day tour of the regions.

The schedule of activity for the Baton's time in Basildon includes schools being invited across the borough to celebrate at Basildon Sporting Village, with a range of sporting activities held throughout the day to reflect the Games.



Stephen Metcalfe, Member of Parliament for South Basildon and East Thurrock, commented: "Schoolchildren from across the borough will enjoy a day of sporting activities as the baton arrives. It will be a most enjoyable festive occasion and I wish to thank the Basildon organising committee for all their hard work in bringing the baton to the borough and wish everyone a wonderful, memorable day."

ENERGY SAVING TIPS, HELP AND ADVICE

Making small changes to our habits around the home can have a big impact on energy bills. Not only will you save money, but you will also help tackle climate change.

Unplugging chargers and standby

- Unplug all chargers when not in use, especially any that have display lights
- Turn off tablets, laptops and consoles as soon as you stop using them, and ideally unplug them

Lighting

- Avoid turning the lights on during the day unless you need them
- Make sure that everyone turns off every light when leaving a room and you can save up to £15 a year
- You can save up to £3 per year for every traditional halogen bulb you switch to a similarly bright LED bulb, equivalent to around 5kg of CO2 emissions

Hot drinks

- Only fill your kettle with the water you need for the number of drinks you are making at the time. This small trick can save around £6 a year.



Keeping it clean

- You can save energy and money by only running your washing machine when full, using the eco mode, and washing at 30 degrees whenever possible
- Only use your dishwasher once full and use the eco setting

Heating

- Only heat the rooms you use
- Try turning the thermostat down degree by degree to find a comfortable temperature - each degree can typically save around £80 a year

FOOD WASTE CADDIES ARE COMING

Households across the borough will soon be receiving new food waste indoor kitchen and outdoor caddies in time for a weekly collection starting this autumn. The change is part of the council's waste strategy which aims to deliver a greener, more efficient service for residents.

Each household will receive a 23-litre outdoor caddy and a 5-litre kitchen caddy for indoor use, and 50 kitchen caddy liners this summer.

From this autumn your separate food and garden waste service will begin:

- Food waste will be collected weekly from your usual point on your usual day
- Garden waste will now be collected fortnightly from your usual point on the same day as glass waste
- Food waste will no longer be accepted in your green wheeled bin
- Food waste will be collected weekly by a new fleet of purpose-built electric vehicles

A CONVERSATION WITH... OUR NEW BIODIVERSITY OFFICER JOSH CHILDS

Basildon resident Josh Childs joined our team recently as the council's Biodiversity Officer. We spoke to Josh to find out a bit more about his role and the person behind it.

What sort of work do you do?

My job centres around trying to improve the biodiversity across the Basildon borough, to benefit the wildlife and residents' enjoyment of our outdoors.

I'm currently working on the 26-acre extension to Wickford Memorial Park. It's exciting because we're transforming former playing fields into a vibrant nature reserve with lots of different elements that will look really attractive and greatly benefit climate change.

We've planted over 3500 trees on the site already with a community orchard being planted later this year, a new wildlife meadow, inland ponds have been installed with aquatic plants, plus we've installed a new corridor between the park and the extension so it's much more accessible.

You care about improving biodiversity - why should other people?

With biodiversity, once we've lost it, it's hard to recreate what it once was. We'd lose all our lovely green spaces; we'd lose our wildlife and pollinators and we'd lose all our food that relies on pollination.

Try and do your bit, even if it's only little, we can all try to be a little more eco-conscious. You can look to buy environmentally friendly packaging, planting pollinator friendly flowers, or helping out in your local green spaces... even just taking a watering can and giving a street tree some life. In a modern world, it's a good feeling knowing that you're doing something that genuinely helps to improve our environment for future generations.

18 months ago, Alexandra and mum Paula decided they had had enough of seeing so much plastic waste and wanted to reduce the amount of single use plastic they used as a household. They soon realised that this was easier said than done, as a lot of plastic isn't recyclable. After learning about refill shops and wishing for one nearby, they decided to open their own.

The Sustainability Store is a refill shop based inside Summerhill Garden Centre, CM11 2UJ, where customers bring their own containers and bottles to fill up on household liquids, dried food, spices and so much more. The store also stocks locally produced items in support of other local producers and businesses. The expert team are always on hand to help customers reduce their waste and live more sustainably.

A CONVERSATION WITH GROUND CONTROL

Tell us about your role with Ground Control.

Basildon Borough is aiming to become carbon net zero by 2050 – how are Ground Control continuing to tackle emissions?

Having achieved carbon neutrality in 2021 we are on course to become carbon net zero. Although we are very proud of our carbon neutrality, we recognise that this doesn't go far enough in our carbon journey as neutrality focuses on the electricity we use and the fossil fuels we burn in our vehicles and plant which makes up just 5% of our carbon emission throughout our operations.



You recently became a Certified B Corporation – what does this mean for you and your customers?

We are incredibly proud of our B Corp accreditation, this means we are verified by B Lab to meet high standards of social and environmental performance, transparency and accountability. The certification addresses the entirety of a business' operations and covers five impact areas - governance, workers, community, environment and customers. The process is rigorous, with applicants required to reach a score over 80 while providing evidence of socially and environmentally responsible practices relating to energy supplies, waste and water use, worker compensation, diversity and corporate transparency.

You won the Queens Award for Enterprise: Innovation in 2021. How is technology helping your business grow?

Our software systems allow our field teams to deliver work for our clients efficiently whilst minimising the routes we travel, thereby minimising vehicle carbon emissions. Technology allows us to grow the business sustainably and rapidly whilst delivering great results.

We all want to do our bit to tackle climate change. What advice would you give to make a small but meaningful lifestyle change?

The biggest change we can make is swapping energy companies to renewable providers.

A meaningful change we can make is changing petrol and diesel cars to electric vehicles. Ground Control is proud to operate one of the largest fleets of Tesla's in Europe and we are soon taking delivery of electric vans for our operational teams.

REDISCOVERING THE BOROUGH'S ROYAL PAST THIS PLATINUM JUBILEE YEAR

This summer the borough celebrated our Queen's Platinum Jubilee, marking 70 years since Her Majesty ascended to the throne following the death of her father King George VI.

Her Majesty has gone on to reign longer than any other British Monarch in history and become a beloved figure around the world.

During her reign, Basildon itself has grown from a new town into an economic hub of south Essex. The rest of the borough's main towns in Billericay, Wickford, Pitsea, and Laindon have each developed an identity of their own.

To mark the occasion, we have taken a trip down memory lane.

Her Majesty opens world's first glass bell tower in St Martin's Square - March 1999

Her Majesty The Queen first visited Basildon in the spring of 1999 to open the world's first glass bell tower, which we now know as St Martin's Bell Tower.

Residents crowded St Martin's Square on March 12 to catch a glimpse of the monarch accompanied by the late Duke of Edinburgh, Prince Philip.

The visit was requested by Canon Lionel Webber, who was rector of St Martin's Church and the church council.

He said the visit marked Basildon's coming of age in its golden anniversary year.

Mr Webber, who was a Queen's chaplain, said at the time: "It's a great honour for the town to welcome the Queen during its 50th anniversary. I am absolutely over the moon that one of her chaplains is welcoming the sovereign into his parish."

Duke and Duchess of Cambridge visit Basildon Sporting Village - October 2018

The crowds were out in force to see the Duke and Duchess of Cambridge arrive at the Basildon Sporting Village for a visit in October 2018.

Other notable visits by royals to the borough include:

- March 4, 1960 Prince Phillip visit to Carreras (cigarette factory near Burnt Mills) and the New Town.
- May 2, 1986: Princess Anne visited Billericay to officially open Archer House, the Abbeyfield property beside Emmanuel Church in Laindon Road. The Princess arrived by a helicopter of the Queen's flight which landed on Sun Corner.
- November 1990: Just six weeks after Her Grace The Duchess of Norfolk opened a new day care unit at St Luke's Hospice in Nethermayne, Basildon, Princess Diana flew in for a second royal visit landing in a RAF Wessex helicopter of the Queen's Flight in Gloucester Park.

Gloucester Park, Basildon

Gloucester Park in Basildon is named after the Duke of Gloucester, who opened the park in 1957.

In the 1970s a six-acre (24,000 m²) artificial fishing lake was made in the park.

The Basildon Sporting Village was built on the northern edge of the park, initially serving as a training camp for the Japanese swim team at the London 2012 Olympics. It is now best known as the home of South Essex Gymnastic Club, where Olympic gold medallist Max Whitlock trains. The Basildon Sporting Village was officially opened by the Duke of Gloucester in 2011.



Howard Diamond Jubilee Park, Pitsea

In 2012, Howard Park in Pitsea was officially renamed Howard Diamond Jubilee Park to commemorate the Queen's Diamond Jubilee that year.

Prior to this, it had been dedicated to the people of Pitsea in 1947 by Mr Harold George Howard, a generous benefactor to the community, a local businessman and founder of Howards Dairies.

He dedicated the land as an open space and handed the park to Billericay Urban District Council in 1951. It was then passed to Basildon Urban District Council when the new town was developed.

Jubilee Clock, Billericay

The clock on St Mary Magdalen Church in the High Street was originally affixed to the tower in 1897 to celebrate Queen Victoria's Diamond Jubilee.

It was paid for by public subscription as well as parish funds, but after 109 years of being the central timepiece of the town it was in need of some maintenance.

At the end of 2006, the clock stopped and on-site repairs failed to solve the issues. Engineers decided that it was necessary to completely remove the clock and send it to Derby for repair and Basildon Council agreed to fund the work.

INCREASING THE BEAUTY OF OUR PARKS AND OPEN SPACES

Our parks are the beating heart of our borough, being places to relax and immerse yourself in the sights, sounds, and smells of nature. We've introduced a few additions that will enhance these aspects, making them more colourful and attractive to visitors, and make them healthier places to reside in too.

We're improving the biodiversity within Gloucester Park, and across Basildon as a result, by Saying No To The Mow in certain, specific areas.

We're still cutting all the areas you would want us to around all the footpaths and facility areas. These are places you may relax for a picnic or kick a ball around, but in some of the more uninhabited areas we're letting it grow a bit more.

Why are we doing it? Well... the leaves, nectar and pollen from blooming flowers provide a vital food source and habitat for wildlife, especially pollinators. Around 97% of our country's wildflowers have been lost in the last 60 years, and currently there is a decline in suitable habitats across the park.

Stunning red pole cattle have been brought into Mill Meadows in recent weeks to start their early spring graze and they're important to help us maintain the 90-acre nature reserve through the warmer months.

The cows target the thick lush grass for grazing, which then gives the chance for the finer grasses and the wildflowers to come through, which are great for pollinators.

Using the cows rather than machinery to manage the reserve means there's less of a carbon footprint, there's less impact on the soil, and as a bonus - they fit into the landscape much better.



BEAUTIFUL TREE CIRCLES TO CELEBRATE THE JUBILEE

Five beautiful tree circles have already started blossoming in parks and open spaces across our borough to create a lasting memory of the Queen's Platinum Jubilee this summer.

The circles have been planted in Gloucester Park, Basildon, South Green Open Space, Billericay, Nevendon Road Recreation Ground, Wickford, Victoria Park, Laindon, and Northlands Park, Pitsea.

The trees are a species named *Prunus Avium's*, a beautiful, pink leaved cherry tree, and 66 have been planted across the five locations.



WILDFLOWER MEADOWS ACROSS THE BOROUGH

You may have noticed them starting to bloom already, but stunning meadows have been created in our open spaces within Lake Meadows, Cranfield Park, Wickford Memorial Park, Kent View Road, Northlands Park and Gloucester Park.

You might also have spotted our wildflower seed mix on roundabouts within the borough, a sight which has become a feature of our borough over the sunnier months in recent years.

OUR ASPIRING TOWN CENTRE

Two pieces of eye catching, and historic artwork are now on display in East Square for everyone to enjoy.

The lenticular screen which allows two contrasting images to change and move as you walk past the screen, creating an illusion, has been installed in East Square.

Architect Pollard Thomas Edwards included the screen within his designs for the East Square complex and is the first of its kind in the borough. Shaun Badham, a local artist coordinated the screen working with Basildon Heritage Group and local schools. The screen includes areas from across Basildon Borough through our parks and open spaces, war memorials, churches, high streets and much more.

Side one is shown in black and white and highlights Basildon's past and present heritage. These images create a landscape showing an alternative skyline of Basildon. Involving local heritage groups and individuals, suggestions were made to include in the alternative skyline of Basildon.

Side two is multicoloured and highlights Basildon's key areas of natural beauty. We are extremely proud of the work completed by ten local primary schools including: Ryedene, Lee Chapel, Millhouse, Fairhouse, Pionner, Janet Duke, Noak Bridge, Great Berry, Northlands and Ghyllgrove School and heritage groups to create the design.

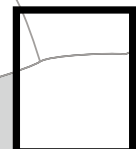

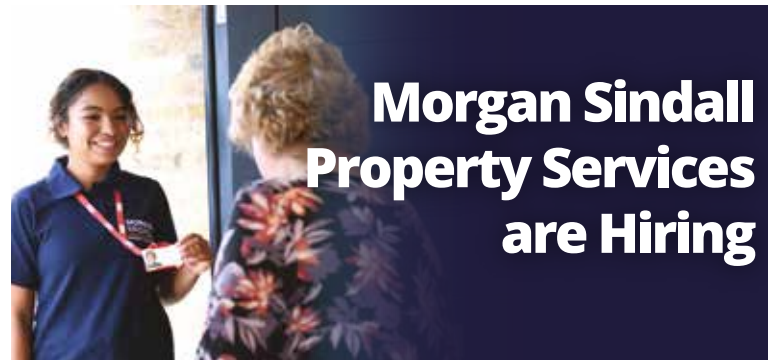
