MULTIPLE AWARD WINS AT PRESTIGIOUS ESSEX HOUSING AWARDS

Basildon Council picked up wins for two separate projects at the prestigious Essex Housing Awards. The annual awards recognise high-quality developments, services, and individuals, and promote best practice across the county from the public, private and voluntary sectors.

This brilliant new homeless facility will help transform lives.

PITSEA POOL

Construction on a new swimming pool for Pitsea is set to begin in early 2023 as councillors agree to award the construction contract to Morgan Sindall Property Services.

The decision was made at a meeting of Basildon Council's Cabinet on Thursday 20 October 2022, subject to finalisation of the contract terms.

The swimming pool will be built as an extension to Eversley Leisure Centre in Pitsea and will be operated by Sports and Leisure Management Limited, which currently operates the existing centre. Facilities will include a four-lane 25-metre pool, dedicated changing facilities and an extension to the existing car park, providing 50 additional parking spaces for those using the centre.

Eversley Leisure Centre, owned by Basildon Council and managed by Everyone Active, currently has a 53 station health and fitness suite, workout and spin studios, as well as a 3G football pitch.

Cabinet Member for Regeneration, Councillor Craig Rimmer, said: "This is an important milestone in the development of a new swimming pool for Pitsea - one which will give residents and pupils in Pitsea access to high quality facilities right on their doorstep. Residents have long asked us for a new pool in Pitsea and I am pleased that we can now look forward to construction."

Leonardo offers the next generation long-term career prospects amidst cost of living crisis.

Aerospace engineering company Leonardo is bucking current economic trends by increasing its early careers population by 50% over the coming year, offering long-term stable employment to local Basildon talent.

Across the UK, Leonardo is planning to hire an additional 300 apprentices, industrial placements and graduate scheme starters in 2023. This will bring the total number of young people on early careers schemes to 900, an increase of 50% in a single year.

The company is committed to creating positive career paths for people aged 16+ and while young job seekers in the Basildon region have found that some employers stipulate applicants must be 18 before applying for apprenticeships, young people are able to start their careers at Leonardo from the age of 16.

Joe Bushell, 17, a first year Manufacturing Technical Apprentice, joined Leonardo last September when he was 16 years of age.

Joe said: "I was fresh out of my GCSEs and I never really got along with school. I am a very practical hands-on learner, so I realised I needed to go out and get started. I applied to five or six companies for apprenticeships, but they all came back and said you either needed to be 18 or you needed a drivers licence. Now I'm at Leonardo I'm attending South Essex College in Basildon for my NVQ and BTEC Engineering Technician course while also learning skills on the job. I guess I would have felt trapped if I hadn't found my apprenticeship at Leonardo, as there would only be one option – go back to school for another two years and not enjoy myself."

YOUR FOOD WASTE BIN IS HERE FOR CHRISTMAS

Christmas is fast approaching and you may have more waste and recycling than usual.

Our separate food waste collection service started in October, and it means you now have a weekly collection specifically for all that extra Christmas grub, including the peelings and bones.

It's important that residents try to reduce the amount of food waste being produced in your household over the Christmas period. Don't overbuy; plan your meals; check use by dates before purchasing; keep leftovers by freezing them and eating them at a later date.

Make sure you recycle all your food waste, so it gets turned into electricity to power our homes, rather than being left to rot in landfill and produce greenhouse gas emissions.

Currently, on average we are collecting over 100 tonnes of food waste a week and we want to thank all residents taking part in the new food waste collection services.

Food waste collections take place weekly on your usual collection day, with garden waste collected fortnightly on the same week as glass.

Collection days will be different over the festive period due to bank holidays. Please look out for your collection calendar coming through your door or quickly and simply on the free 'Our Streets Basildon' app.



ANDY'S MAN CLUB

The lead-up to Christmas can be a difficult time for many, it's important to know you're not alone and there are safe places to talk about your mental health.

Andy's Man Club is a men's suicide prevention charity, offering support groups across the UK and online. Their aim is to end the stigma surrounding Men's mental health and help them through the power of conversation.

The club is available for men aged over 18 and is free to attend every Monday except bank holidays. The group gives men the opportunity to open up about issues affecting their lives in a safe, judgement-free and non-clinical environment. They are free of pressure and there is no obligation to speak, they can simply listen if they wish.

There are over 2000 men using sessions across the UK every week, and an army of 500 volunteers on board.

RECONNECT WITH OUR BOROUGH'S NATURE

Planting, rewilding, and restoration projects have taken over our parks, grass verges, and woodland areas, to give residents more opportunities to enjoy the outdoors and reconnect with nature.

Over 7,000 trees will be planted across the borough this year, including 400 in Lake Meadows, and 400 in Pleasant Drive to extend the current woodland area.

We have also planted hedgerow in a number of locations, which will provide vital shelter and food sources for our borough's wildlife, as well as be more attractive for our residents to look at when passing by.

150m has been planted as part of our new Legacy Park Nature Zone in Pitsea, 50m's now stretches along Durban Lane in Noak Bridge, and 450m as part of major outdoor improvement works in St Nicholas Lane, Laindon.

Restoration works have taken place to create a diverse habitat around our borough's grass verge areas.

Works have taken place along roads including Nethermayne, Noak Hill Road, and Staneway, to create an effective habitat for wildlife to thrive, as well as allow for an array of wildflowers to form that will provide a food source for pollinators.



Then next autumn, the 50% which has been left uncut will be mown, cut, and cleared, with the other 50% left. By cutting alternating sections, it creates a mosaic of habitats and microclimates that will benefit our plant life, wildlife, and our residents.

Cabinet Member for Health, Wellbeing, Leisure, Arts and Culture, Councillor Jeff Henry, said "We are making small but significant changes to our green spaces to improve our borough, but also to improve our health and wellbeing. We can all benefit from more time out and enjoying the fantastic spaces right here on our doorstep."


