
## Linking Planning, Health and Wellbeing

## Introduction

Following a thorough literature review carried out to support the health and wellbeing topic paper, the following three self-assessment checklists have been applied to the Basildon Local Plan Draft 2016 to ensure that health and wellbeing issues have been appropriately considered as part of the suite of policies contained within.

The Checklists used have been derived and partly amended from the following sources:

- TCPA/Public Health England (Dec 2014) <u>Planning Healthy Weight Environments</u> (pages 12 13)
- NHS London Healthy Urban Development Unit (Mar 2014) <u>Healthy Urban Planning</u> <u>Checklist</u> (pages 9 – 20)
- TCPA (Jul 2015) <u>Public Health in Planning Good Practice</u> (page 18)

The criteria contained within these checklists have been used to review all relevant policy or supporting text references to an issue. Therefore in a number of cases a number of policies have been considered for each criteria within the checklist.

To avoid repetition within the three checklists contained within this document, any criteria that have been appropriately considered in a previous table are cross-referenced in subsequent tables rather than having that assessment repeated.
